GCT opens season with revue 'Rogers Ala Carte'

GILROY — Gilroy Community Theater's first production of the season, the musical revue Rogers Ala Carte, opens for a four-day run Thursday.

It's basically a low-budget moneymaker, like last year's Side by Side by Sondheim. And like Side by Side, GCT hopes, it will draw sell-out crowds and be extended for another weekend.

Right after Rogers Ala Carte GCT will hold rehearsals for the big August production, South Pacific, said George Costa, director.

Ala Carte is basically a bunch of Richard Rogers' most wellloved songs cleverly strung together and sung by two or more people.

Eight of last year's Sondheim singers return for Ala Carte—Richard Nelson, Betsy Andrade, Phil Skiver, Ruthe Mullins, Ted Sanchez, Steve Schneickert and Dennis Charvez, with Marilyn Guerin at the piano.

Three newcomers to the revue (but old-timers to theater) join them: Rosalind Farotte, Russ Hendrickson and Sandy Rapazinni, all from Gilroy.

For the first time, GCT will utilize as its theater the dance floor at Le Grand Etage School of Dance above the old Strand Theater on Monterey Street. sons' Lodge. It can accomodate 150 people.

Shows will begin at 7 and 10 p.m. June 21 through 24. Cost will be \$7.50 for adults and \$5.50 for children, students and seniors

The revue will string together songs like Bewitched, Manhatten and Funny Valentine, which Rogers composed with Lorenz

Hart; I Enjoy Being a Girl, The Most Beautiful Girl In The World and June Is Busting Out All Over, which he composed with Oscar Hammerstein; Do I Hear A Waltz — by Rogers and Stephen Sondheim; Rogers' and Martin Charnin's Two by Two; No Strings the title song from the Rogers' musical score by the same name; and a medley from that musical called The Sweet Sounds.

Rogers had a long career as composer and songwriter the brought him together with oth musical genuises of his time Rogers and Hammerstein wrothe musical score for Oklahor in 1943, Carousel in 1945, Sou Pacific in 1949, and The Sou of Music in 1959.
