

His first appearance in a GCT production was as "Sky Masterson" in "Guys and Dolls."Since then Russ has appeared in "Pajama Game," "Fiddler "Pajama Game," "Fiddler on the Roof," "My Fair Lady," "Lion in Winter," "Man for All Seasons," "Kiss Me Kate," and "The Crucible." He directed "Harvey," "A Thousand

Clowns," "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying" and "1776."

In addition to his active involvement with GCT, he directed "West Side Story," "Oliver" (where he also played Fagin), "Anything Goes," and "Bye, Bye Birdie." Russ moved to Gilroy in 1966. He teaches speech, drama, debate, humanities, English and German at Gilroy High School. Russ's wife Nancy has deep roots in Gilroy. Her great grandmother came to Gilroy in the 1880's. Nancy is the director of a private school in Gilroy. Russ and Nancy have four children.

MARY JANE GORAK

Mary Jane Gorak (Sugar) is a relatively new but welcome addition to the list of celebrated performers of Gilroy Community Theatre. She

brought with her many years of acting and choreography experience. Over the past ten years she has been very active in Santa Clara Valley theatre and musical groups. She served as choreographer for West Valley Light Opera for two seasons. Among the numerous musicals she

has appeared in were: MARY JANE GORAK "Oklahoma,", "Brigadoon," "Kismet," "Student Prince," "South Pacific," "Cabaret," and "Jesus Christ Superstar." Earlier this year Mary worked backstage in GCT's production of "The Crucible," on sound effects.

Mary was graduated from the University of California at Irvine with a degree in drama. She also earned a Masters degree in musical theatre directing from San Jose State University. She credits her talent in choreography to her many years of training with Eugene Toring and Marion Lindsay.

SAM TALLUTO

Sam Talluto (music director) was born in Chicago. He earned his B.A. degree in English from the University of Washington and attended

the graduate School of Music at San Jose State University. He feaches instrumental music in the Cupertino School District. He has played flute for 24 years and is currently the first flute with Los Gatos/ Saratoga Symphony, Sam has been musical director for "Robin Hood" and "The Apple Tree" at San Jose State and "The Three

Penny Opera" at San Jose Theatre Guild. With GCT he directed the music for "Cabaret" and with Milpitas Community Players the music for "West Side Story."

BRAD RYDER

Brad Ryder (Jerry) came to the South County from the Los Angeles area ten years ago. He has been active in theatre groups since his high

school days and portrayed "Creon" in "Antigone," a production staged by the Gilroy High School prior to his graduation in 1969. While attending Pasadena City College he appeared "Johnny" in Sean O'Casey's "I Knock at the Door.

His first appearance on the stage of a GCT production was as "Benny South-

street" in "Guys and Dolls." After being away for four years from the stage Brad won the part of "Reverend John Hale" in the GCT production of "The Crucible."

Brad is also associated with a local repertory group "South End," now giving performances of "Interviews" and "Comings and Goings" in the South County. At present Brad is working towards a degree in theatre arts with emphasis in broadcasting at San Jose State University.


