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Betsy McIntosh came to Gilroy with her daughter about two years ago from New York. Since joining Gilroy Community Theatre, she has appeared in *Sugar* and *Play It Again, Sam.* She also played in *Godspell* for Gavilan College. Prior to coming to Gilroy, Betsy played the lead role in *Carousel.* When not on stage, Betsy teaches at the Learning Center, a private school in Gilroy. Betsy is currently serving as a member of the Board of Directors of Gilroy Community Theatre.

James Mead Maya is a drama instructor at Gilroy High School and also a well recognized and celebrated director and actor in the South Valley. He traced his interest in theatre back to the days when he attended college in Indiana. James is well remembered for his role as John Procter in *The Crucible*, John Adams in 1776, Oscar in *The Odd Couple*, and Herr Schultz in *Cabaret*. He directed Plaza Suite, Lion in Winter and Play It Again, Sam. James is quoted to have said "I feel very fortunate to have moved to Gilroy because they have an excellent community theatre."





Marty Pyle received her formal music training from Geneva College in Pennsylvania and the Cleveland Institute of Music. She has sung professionally since the age of three. Gilroy Community Theatre has been privileged over the past few years to have Marty as an active member on the Board of Directors. Marty appeared as Abigail Adams in 1776 and the female lead in the smashing hit I Do! I Do!, the first dinner show presented by Gilroy Community Theatre this Spring. Music is definitely a part of Marty and she considered music to be as much a part of her as her hands.

Laura Almada is a June graduate of Gilroy High School and she plans to attend the University of California at Santa Barbara majoring in marine biology this fall. Laura has appeared in *Anything Goes, Kiss Me Kate, The Crucible* and *Bye Bye Birdie* for the High School and Gilroy Community Theatre. She is currently an artist at Marriott's Great America.



Mark Shiplett is a new comer to Gilroy. Prior to coming west, Mark played the leading roles of *Adams Apple Tree, Little Mary Sunshine* and *Sweet Charity* when he was living in New Jersey. At nineteen years of age, Mark is an established professional model and also a teacher of modeling.





Ann Zuhr and her husband, Ken, came to Gilroy four years ago. She and he husband both appeared in *Sugar* for Gilroy Community last year. When no involved with the theatre, Ann teaches mathematics at Gilroy High Schoo The Zuhrs are very active in the American Field Service Student Exchang Program.

Roger Bennett is making his theatrical debut in *The Sound of Music*. Gilroy Community Theatre Board member, Sonja Walker, recognized his talent and urged him to appear on stage, better late than never. Roger is an assistant principal at Live Oak High School in Morgan Hill.





Russell Hendrickson is a twelve year resident of Gilroy. He is one of the founder of Gilroy Community Theatre and played the lead in the first two musicals Guys and Dolls and Pajama Game. Since then Russ has appeared or directe numerous shows which included: 1776, Sugar, The Crucible, Kiss Me Kate Thousand Clowns, Harvey, and How to Succeed in Business Without Reall Trying. When he finds time to be away from the theatre, Russ teaches Germa at Gilroy High School and South Valley Junior High School. Russ is quote to have said "Being a director is the closest I come to being an artist. I enjoy th creativity and watching the play come to life."

Greta Tegel was trained in England where she studied ballet, tap, national cabaret and modern musical. She is a qualified instructor in all phases of dancing. After receiving her training from the London Academy of Dramatic Art and Music, Greta danced professionally for six years on stage, television and movies and appeared in many musicals in London and Germany. She choreographed for the Ballet Monte Parness and was the director at The International Dance Academy in Vancouver, Canada. Besides being the choreographer for *The Sound of Music*, Greta is busy working on a Disco Fashion Show for the Turkey Trot Tennis Tournament slated to open on November 18 this year at the DeAnza Raquet Club. In her spare time she is currently teaching a stage workshop at Gilroy High School and plans to produce a Christmas show with all her elementary, intermediate and advance students at Gavilan this year.



Creighton Yip is a graduate of the University of the Pacific and has resided in Gilroy for the past ten years. He is a musica director and instructor for the Gilroy Unified School District. Creighton, like Russ, has been involved in numerous Gilroy Community Theatre productions since its founding. Among the plays that Creighton directed the musical scores for are Guys and Dolls, Pajama Game, How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying, and Fiddler on the Roof. Creighton' interest in music started when he was a fourth grader. Currently he is a member of Herb Miller's dance band.
