




About the Players

Ruth E. Mullins (Mame): Veteran entertainer Ruth E. Mullins brings her numerous years of theatre experience to our stage tonight, in this, her eighth summer musical production with SVCT. She has performed across the country in various "rock" groups, Big Bands, and choirs—the most recent being the SJS University Chorale under the direction of maestro George Cleve. She strongly believes in not having one bit of spare time—"After all, life's too short!" Ruth E. dedicates her performance as Mame to all those who dare to be different!

Sam Sauer (Younger Patrick): Sam is a ten year old fifth grader at Brownell School. He loves singing in the shower, collecting baseball cards, and playing basketball and Nintendo. Sam was allowed to join the school district elementary honor choir as a third grader, and has been an active member ever since. Sam played a part in SVCT's *Tom Sawyer* and the poor crippled shepherd boy in the opera *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. Most recently, Sam played the lead in the junior cast of *Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*.
