John Adams thought that July 2nd. the day Declaration was voted in would be reclarated... with pomp and parade... trom one end of this continent to the other..." The historical content of 1776 is mostly true, if you don't count the singing and the dancing (though who really knows?). The scriptwriters did include a few literary licenses, but those changes they made were almost all purely because they were condensing history to fit onstage.

For example, there were in reality 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence. Unfortunately, we would be unable to fit 56 men on our stage to fill up the Congress.

Throughout the program, we have scattered notes on the truths behind the musical, and encourage you to look up more

information on your own if you are so inclined. The depth of our history is incredible, and only so much can be covered in an evening's entertainment.




