





A message from SVCT's President

Welcome to SVCT's production of "Inherit the Wind." As many of you know, when this play debuted in 1955, it was the authors' intent to criticize Senator Joseph McCarthy and the anti-communist hysteria manifested in the investigations of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. As co-author Jerome Lawrence commented in a 1996 interview, "We used the teaching of evolution as a parable, a metaphor for any kind of mind control [...] It's not about science versus religion. It's about the right to think." Of course, because of the threat of blacklisting, the authors had to make their point indirectly, discretely, nonpolitically. So they chose a different setting, a different intolerance.

I love a play like this -- especially this play -- simply because it makes you think. For example, it makes me think about the tyranny of fearful majorities and their use of authority and excessive regulation to enforce conformance and restrict freedom. (Okay, so we just built a home and can't believe the things the County made us do and what they charged for it.) It makes me think too on the irony that the pendulum of political correctness has swung so far the other way today that in many parts of the country John Scopes could be tried and convicted for teaching Creationism in a public school. (Do we really have to relearn the pledge of allegiance without the "G" word?) Incidentally, this was a re-write that our Producer and Director briefly considered until the words "copyright infringement" found their way into the conversation.

Our show's producer, Beth Dewey, loves Drummond's question to Brady, "Do you ever think about what you think about?" because educators can use it to teach critical thinking skills. My personal favorite is Drummond's line about the possible length of the "days" of Genesis, because it makes me think about the good in seeking reconciliation instead of conflict. So you get the idea -- enjoy the show, note your favorite line, and share with someone what it makes you think about. We hope to see you again in October when we serve up "Damn Yankees" for the very first time at SVCT.

Inherit The Wind is not history. The events which took place in Dayton, Tennessee, during the scorching July of 1925 are clearly the genesis of this play. It has, however, an exodus entirely its own.

Only a handful of phrases have been taken from the actual transcript of the famous Scopes trial. Some of the Characters of the play are related to the colorful figures in that battle of giants; but they have life and language of their own - and, therefore, names of their own.


The greatest reporters and historians of the century have written millions of words about the "Monkey Trial." We are indebted to them for their brilliant reportage. And we are grateful to the late Arthur Garfield Hays, who recounted to us much of the unwritten vividness of the Dayton adventure from his own memory and experience.

The collision of Bryan and Darrow at Dayton was Dramatic, but it was not a drama. Moreover, the issues of their conflict have acquired new dimensions and meaning in the years since the clashed at Rhea County Courthouse. So *Inherit The Wind* does not pretend to be journalism. It is theatre. It is not 1925...it might have been yesterday. It could be tomorrow.





John Brewer ~ Harry Y. Esterbrook, Elijah, Reuters Man




Weilan Cui ~ Reporter

Leslie Lamcke ~ Tom Davenport






Scott Lynch ~ Rev. Jeremiah Brown


Haylee Merrill ~ Mrs. McLain

James (Dan) Pearson \sim Henry Drummond





John (John-John) Soto, Jr. ~ Phil, Eskimo Pie Vendor, Monkey Puppetier




