

Shedding light on the script...

Cobble Hill Park, on Clinton Street, was created in 1965. It was reconstructed in 1989. winning the 1988 Annual Award for Excellence in Design from the Art Commission and the Parks Council's Philip Winslow Award for Public Projects in 1990, the first time it was awarded. The new design reflected the 19th-century brick-and-stone character of the tree-lined neighborhood.

Whitman Park is a neighborhood park in Camden, New Jersey.

Antril (Anakinra) is a drug that was developed for treating rheumatoid arthritis.

The BQE (Brooklyn-Queens Expressway) is an auxiliary Interstate Highway in New York and New Jersey.

The F-Train (F Sixth Avenue Local) is a rapid transit service in the B Division of the New York City Subway.

Clafoutis comes from the Limousin region of France, and while black cherries are traditional, there are numerous variations using other fruits. When other kinds of fruit are used instead of cherries, the dish is properly called a flaugnard.

Bryan Freeman ~ Director




