Entering its forty-eighth year, South Valley Civic Theatre offers a variety of shows to appeal to our audience. SVCT is pleased to offer an "extra" show this season as we present *Tru*, the 1990 Drama Desk Award winner for Outstanding One-Person Show.

Adapted from the words and works of Truman Capote, *Tru* takes place in the writer's New York City apartment during the week before Christmas, 1975. An excerpt from Capote's infamous novel *Answered Prayers* has recently been published in *Esquire* and the author's friends, recognizing the characters as thinly veiled versions of themselves, have turned their backs on the man they once considered a close confidant.

"It is two hours spent on the edge, balancing precariously between comedy and tragedy, between laughter and tears, between the raucousness of exuberant performance and the quiet whimpers of inner torment...Any who remember Capote's look-at-me flamboyance...would have to wonder if he would continue to exist without an audience. That you are watching Capote face the prospect of such a life while you are a member of an audience just adds a touch of surreality...The only real problem is that, as must have been the case with most evenings spent in Capote's presence, it ends all too soon." - *The Baltimore Sun*

Coming next month is our Teen Musical – *Leader of the Pack: The Ellie Greenwich Story.* This hit Broadway musical retrospective was a 1985 Tony Award nominee for Best Musical and celebrates the life and times of Ellie Greenwich, whose doo wop sounds soared to the top of the music charts in the 1960's. Bill Tindall ~ Truman Capote

Bill hales from the Mississippi Delta where he was loved by a huge extended family during his formative years in the 60's and 70's. His family was full of real characters who embraced life on their own terms. Growing up at ground zero of the Civil Rights Movement and experiencing all the passions of that period has given Bill insight into people and the emotions they experience while facing extreme situations. He draws from these wonderful people for his characters on stage.

Bill has lived in California since the age of 24 and has worked as an interior designer all those years. He is the proprietor of Brotin Design Inc., a design firm serving the Bay Area since 1988. The acting bug bit him ten years ago when he first appeared in a local production of *Boeing*, *Boeing*. The infection grew as he portrayed numerous roles in area theaters, playing everyone from the greedy Potter in *It's a Wonderful Life* to the cantankerous Aunt Pearl and ten other characters in *Tuna Christmas*. Bill played a homophobic dad in *Norman*, *Is That You?* followed by a lovable grandfather in *You Can't Take It With You*. Bill has brought numerous other characters to life, not only on SVCT's stage, but also at Limelight Actors Theater and Pintello Comedy Theater.

The role of Truman Capote is a dream come true for Bill. He saw the original Broadway version in the 1990's and later in 2010 he saw a great production in Palm Springs. He is thrilled to portray this iconic figure of American literature here at SVCT and would like to thank the Board for this opportunity to be the first "one man show" on their stage. Watch what you wish for! Bill thanks his producer, Scott Lynch, for "going above and beyond what is expected" and his directors, Carol Harris and Matthew Hendrickson, for "their relentless and loving direction." 



Who's Who In Tru's World

Black and White Ball, 1996: Truman's masquerade ball held at the Plaza Hotel in New York City. The ball was in honor of *The Washington Post* publisher Katharine Graham. Throwing the party for himself would have been viewed by his society friends as vulgar. "Truman called me up that summer and said, 'I think you need cheering up. And I'm going to give you a ball.'...I was...sort of baffled....I felt a little bit like Truman was going to give the ball anyway and that I was part of the props." Five hundred people attended - even so, there were numerous exclusions. "If you weren't invited – you left town."

Babe Paley, Lady 'Slim' Keith, Marella Agnelli, C.Z. Guest, Gloria Vanderbilt, Gloria Guinness, Lee Radziwell: Truman's "Swans" – he called them this 'for their beauty, their charm, and not surprisingly because they all seemed to be endowed with long necks." George Plimpton

Billy Redanty (real name is John O'Shea): New York banker, married with four children, Truman's lover. Truman became close with O'Shea's wife and family – even having his youngest daughter live at his NY apartment with him. Temperamental, violent and manipulative – O'Shea worked for Truman and traveled with him. Attempted to take control of Tru's literary and business interests.

Colette: French novelist nominated for the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1948. Also an actress, mime and journalist. Truman wrote a short story about her (1970) called "The White Rose".

Gerald Clarke – Truman's biographer – his highly acclaimed book was published after Truman's death.

Gianni & Marella Agneli – He: Lawyer and Chairman of Fiat, (referred to as "Avvocato"). She: Italian noblewoman, socialite, style icon.

Irving "Swift" Lazar: American talent agent and dealmaker, representing both movie stars and authors. Renowned for his annual post-Academy Award party – the place to be. His event was widely regarded as the most important Oscar celebration, and those who received invitations were regarded as the inner circle.

Jack Dunphy: American author and playwright. He and Truman met in 1948 and were lovers for 3 years and remained close for 35 years. Truman's first and only love. Dunphy was more private and reserved than his partner. "I never went on anyone's yacht, even though I was invited. I think I would have become a drunk or a terrific pleaser if I had."

Princess Pignatelli – Italian socialite who was a social arbiter and a jewelry designer. Married two very wealthy men.


