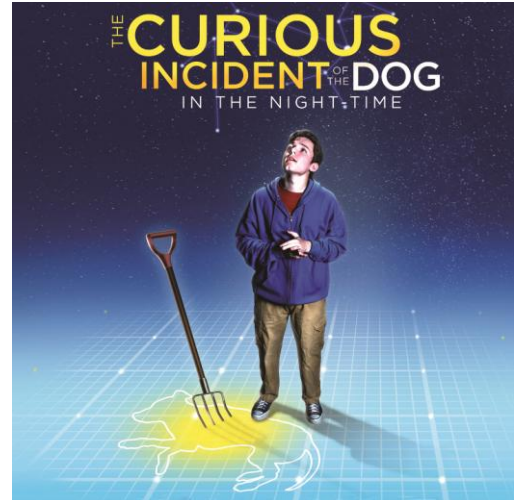


The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time

Inclusive Performance

The play features a 15-year-old boy on the autism spectrum who is attempting to solve the mystery of who killed his neighbor's dog.



The uniqueness of this play comes from its use of technology and movement -- lighting, sound, choreographed crowd scenes, and projections -- to show how sensory stimulation can be overwhelming to an individual with autism.

Unlike a typical "sensory friendly" theatrical performance, because it is so essential to what the play tries to depict, we will NOT be toning down the lighting and sound. However, we recognize that some audience members may find this environment overwhelming at times. We therefore anticipate that they might vocalize and may need to move around or even leave the audience.

Parents with children on the autism spectrum have found this play provides a unique insight into how their children experience the world. We encourage members of the autism community and their friends and families to attend.

Please note that this play contains strong language and some intense scenes with adult situations. It may be too intense for younger children. Parental guidance is recommended for pre-teens.
