


The Wolves - Roles

#11: Midfield – (Seventeen)

Brainy, morbid, budding elitist, thoughtful. Curious about the world and grapples with questions of morality.

"I never said we should take our liberties for granted."

#25: Defense, Captain – (Seventeen)

Classic (ex)coach's daughter. Works to keep everyone in line, both physically and socially, while also making an attempt to strike out on her own with a new relationship.

"I mean we like to have fun but you know uh 'if you can't say something nice don't say anything at all'?"

#13: Midfield – (Sixteen)

Stoner, older pot dealer brother, into her wackiness. Self-medicates with marijuana and attempts to understand the complexity of relationships.

"We should be like very very thankful for our liberties you know."

#2: Defense – (Sixteen)

Innocent, unlucky, kind, skinny. More innocent than the other girls, has strong religious beliefs and a secret eating disorder.

"I eat plenty of protein I like basically live on peanut butter and cheese!"

#14: Midfield – (Sixteen)

#7's insecure sidekick. Just switched to contacts. Tries to be as cool as her friend #7, but struggles with the pressure of sex and growing up before she is quite ready. She brings orange slices to practice and the team takes a photo with orange slices in their mouths, growing closer.

"...alright, um, look fierce."

#46: Bench – (Sixteen)

New girl. Awkward, different. Struggles awkwardly, and often unsuccessfully, to fit in, but eventually proves that she is a worthy teammate.

"Why can't I make a pregnancy joke?"

#7: Striker – (Almost Seventeen)

Too cool for school. Sarcastic. "fuck," thick eyeliner. Loses a bit of her cool factor when she gets injured and has to miss the last game in the season. She watches in dismay as #46 appears to usurp her position as striker.

"We don't do genocides 'til senior year."

#8: Defense - (Sixteen)

Plays dumber than she is so that people will like her. Sixteen.

"I am getting such a bad grade in social studies."

#00: Goalie – (Seventeen)

Intense performance anxiety, perfectionist, high achiever. Seventeen. #00 copes with intense anxiety which causes her to vomit before every game.

"Hey my ACL's acting up."

Soccer Mom – (late thirties to late forties)

Soccer Mom shows up at practice after the death of her daughter, bringing with her a bag of orange slices and grief.

"You're not getting any younger you know?"
