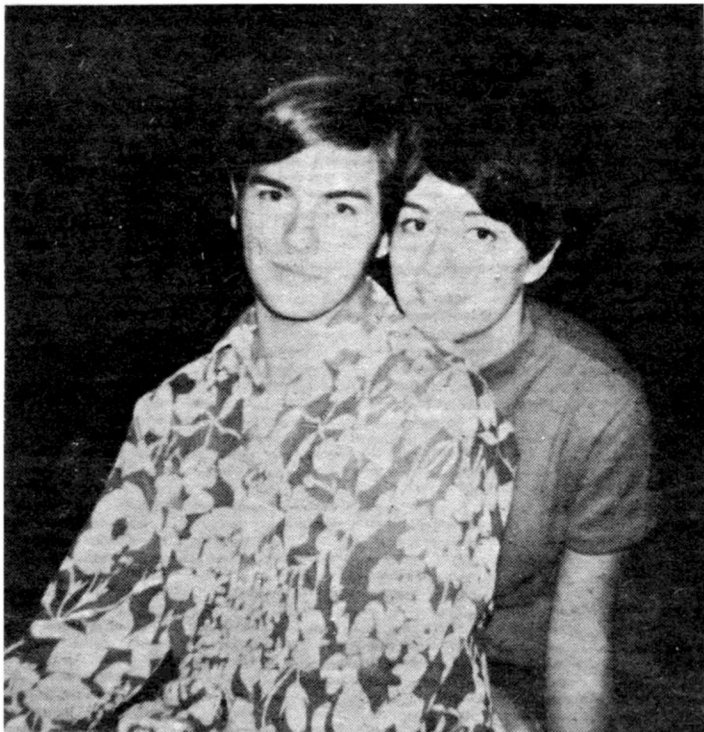


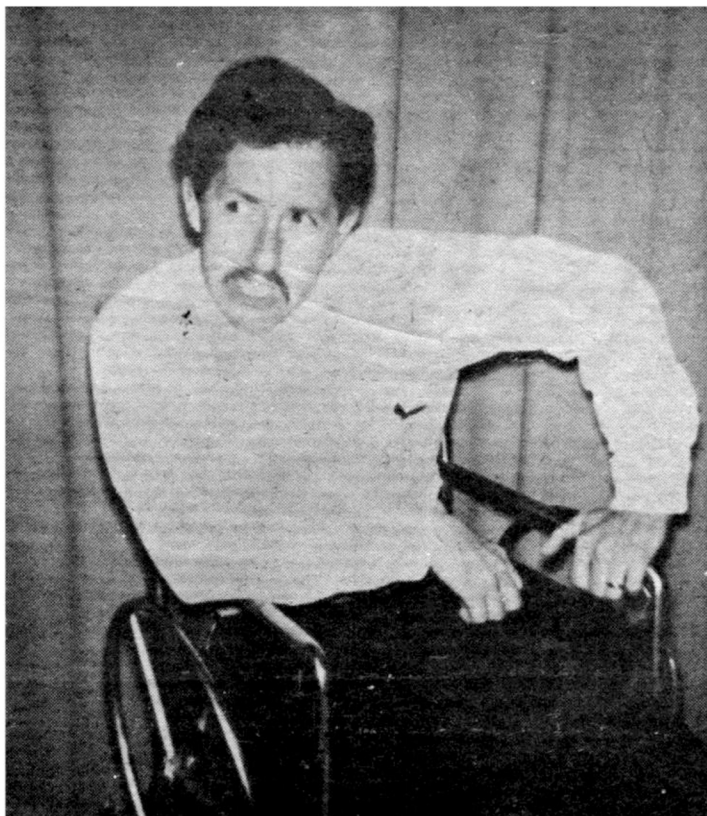
# Community Theatre...

## Theatre group schedules play

A veteran of many years of theatre experience, Mary Ann Bruegmann, will direct the Gilroy Community Theatre's third production of the year, "Boy Meets Girl," scheduled for April 3, 4, 10, 11.

As stage manager of the Community Theatre's last production, "Barefoot In the Park," Mrs. Bruegmann brought to the newly formed group experience in stagecraft gained in numerous productions since her teen years when she started acting as a student at Santa Clara High School.

As a member of Bishop Players in Santa Clara she appeared in "Student Prince," "On the Town" and "Broadway Melody," and she later became assistant to the executive producer of the San Jose Light Opera Company.

During her association with the Light Opera group, she appeared as Hedy in "How to Succeed in Business," as Ursula in "Sweet Charity," and assisted in producing "West Side Story," "Most Happy Fellow," "Camelot," "My Fair Lady" and "The Sound of Music."

She also toured military bases with "Kismet," "Bye, Bye Birdie," and with the light opera's summer workshop program.

When asked to direct for the Gilroy Community Theatre, Mrs. Bruegmann, wife of Bob Bruegmann, and mother of seven, chose the 1935 hit play of Broadway, "Boy Meets Girl," a story of Hollywood film writers by Bella and Samuel Spewack.

Unlike the two earlier productions of the group, "Come Blow Your Horn," and "Barefoot In the Park," which were light comedies, the April production is a satirical play which will give the large cast an exercise in subtle humor.

A membership drive is now being conducted by the local theatre group to encourage interested citizens to become part of the rapidly growing organization. Active members form the nucleus of the Community Theatre, but sponsors who lend assistance through contributions and attendance, also play an important role, Bob Stanley, membership chairman said.

# Theatre group stages new play

A team of film writers with a love of the great gag will take the spotlight on April 3, 4, 10 and 11 when the Gilroy Community Theatre presents its third production of the season, "Boy Meets Girl," at the Gavilan College Theatre.

The three-act farce by Bella and Samuel Spewack, directed by Mary Ann Breugmann, is set against a Hollywood backdrop with the main characters, a team of rebellious film writer, portrayed by Bob Stanley and Al Bloom.
