She has appeared recently in <u>Jerry's Girls</u> and <u>Nunsense</u> at Center Stage and in SVCT's production of <u>Mame</u>. A teahcer in the Evergreen School District, Carol resides in Gilroy with her husband Dave.

NAOMI ALLEN (**Accompanist**) is the accompanist for the Gilroy High School Concert Choir and also accompanies many of the elementary school choirs in Gilroy. She has been a piano teacher for over 25 years. She is also the organist for her church. This is her first experience accompanying an SVCT production.

BETSY ANDRADE (Director's Assistant) has been involved with SVCT since 1978. She has performed in musicals, dramas, comedies as well as musical reviews. Betsy also wore the director's cap when she directed the young performers in Bye, Bye Birdie and the adults in the dinner show Same Time Next Year. For the past five years Betsy has been pursuing a career in film and TV work. She has appeared in several commercials and industrial films, and had a role in an NBC movie of the week last spring. Next spring Betsy will be directing the teens of SVCT in Grease.

CAST BIOGRAPHIES

She has performed as a studio session vocalist, TV and radio actress, big band vocalist, church choir member, and SJSU Alumni Chorale member. Ruth E. wishes SVCT the best of luck in their new playhouse and thanks the kids for letting her come out and "play" with them!

GARY CASWELL JR (**Professor/Aslan**) made his stage debut 4 years ago in My Sister Eileen at Live Oak High. Since then, he has been very busy with the theater. Narnia is his 18th show. He was most recently seen in SVCT's Oliver! as the evil Bill Sikes. Other favorite roles have been Big Jule (Guys and Dolls), the Narrator (The Rocky Horror Show), Mr. Upson (Mame) and Lt. Shrank (West Side Story). Gary also appeared in SVCT's Camelot and The Sound of Music, as well as shows with Center Stage and Gavilan College also. Gary is very excited about this first show at our new playhouse, and wishes to thank Carol Harris, Ruth E. Mullins and all the talented young performers.

TIANA BRADY (White Stag) has appeared in two other SVCT plays, Alice and Oliver! She has been in one SJCLO play, The Wizard of Oz. She likes to sing, dance and act. In the future she hopes to go to college and study acting. She would like to become a professional actress someday. Tiana has been taking classical ballet for 8 years, classical piano for 5 1/2 years and takes tap and jazz. Tiana has been in San Jose Dance Theater's Nutcracker as a soldier and as a cookie at the Center for Performing Arts in San Jose. She attended COPA, a theatre workshop, and studies voice, acting, dancing and modeling. She attended STAR and got the lead role as Atalanta in the play, Atalanta.

JASON DOUGHERTY (**Edmund**) is 12 years old and in the 7th grade at South Valley Junior High. He has been in several stage and school productions and has appeared in a made-for-TV movie. He also plays both the trumpet and the piano. He has been in scouting for 4 years and hopes to achieve Eagle Scout in the next few years. He enjoys skiing, baseball and reading in his spare time.

BROOKE E. HOFFMAN (Lucy) made her SVCT debut as one of "Fagin's Boys" in this summer's Oliver!

Previously, she performed in three productions of the San Jose Dance Theatre's Nutcracker. Brooke is a member of the School Honor Choir in Gilroy and has studied classical ballet for nine years. Brooke's favorite place is Yosemite and she enjoys swimming and bike riding in her spare time. In the future, Brooks hopes to attend UCLA and major in theatre.

ELISSA BETH STEBBINS (**Susan**) is 10 years old and the youngest of 7 children. She is influenced by her family's talents in art, music, and drama and their flair for comedy which they freely share. Elissa's role as Susan Pevensie is her first lead in an SVCT production. She has also been in <u>Mame</u> with 4 other family members, and <u>Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat</u>. She has performed many times, singing, dancing or playing piano at church, school and recitals. Elissa loves to collect shells, play with her 4-month-old nephew Adam, compose songs on the piano, write, and draw. She hopes to incorporate these interests into her future career.

EVAN PRIESKOP (**Peter**) has performed in both northern and southern California. With the Los Angeles Starmakers Company, Evan portrayed Ben in <u>Tom Sawyer</u> and the Scarecrow in <u>The Wizard of Oz.</u> Evan sang in the advanced encore choir in Pasadena and currently sings with the Wayfarers, a San Jose-based madrigal group. An admittedly indifferent student in most school subjects, Evan nonetheless has a passion for science, fantasy games and the dulcimer. 


