Each show during each season is an encore presentation for some of our actors and staff, and a preview of things to come for other participants. There are novice 10-year-old actors standing at the footlights for the first time this season, and experienced theater professionals acting and directing - some of whom actually got their start in our annual children's and teens' productions!

After thirty years we continue to celebrate the efforts and support of all those people who are actually the heart of community theater. Live theater is exciting on stage, community theater is exciting in the wings, too! We can all be proud of these past thirty years, and we are right to anticipate at least another thirty great years.
