

Director's Notes

Welcome to Runyonland — that enticingly zany version of New York City where the average character on the street corner is a colorful gambler or the slightly ditzy nightclub doll he is alternately taking out or trying to avoid. Damon Runyon wrote his short stories in the late 1920's and 30's, populating them with the down-on-their-luck gangsters and gamblers of the prohibition era and their "dolls." These shady characters were so popular in their time that they became the subjects of many a movie script. (For example, Jack Lemon's role as the Lemon Drop Kid in the movie of the same name was based on a single short story by Runyon.)

When compiling these character sketches into the script for the Broadway musical you are about to experience, Swerling and Burrows transported our "guys" and their "dolls" to the early 1950's. If you listen closely, however, you can still pick out references to that earlier, more colorful era. Get to know Sarah Brown, the mission evangelist searching for that small-town prince she might never find and Sky Masterson who got his nickname because whenever he bets the "sky's the limit!" Meet characters like Big Jule, the visiting gangster from Chicago, Miss Adelaide, the perennial fiancée, and her unwilling "intended," Nathan Detroit.

Let us transport you back in time to a simpler place when the most burning question was, "Where's the crap game?" Sit back, relax, and enjoy the show with us! Oh, and would you like strudel or cheesecake with that?


Lane Grover — "Sky Masterson"


