

President's Message

Deathtrap holds the record for the longest running comedy-thriller on Broadway with over 1800 performances from 1978 to 1982. It earned author Ira Levin an Edgar Award and a 1978 nomination for a Tony Award for Best Play. Deathtrap has been revived frequently and was adapted into a film starring Christopher Reeve, Michael Caine and Dyan Cannon.

The preface to the published script describes it as "something so evil that it infects all who touch it ... Levin has taken the basic components of thrillers and horror stories - murder, deceit, innocent dialogue with hidden sinister meanings, plot reversals, unexpected turns of events, etc. - and twisted and rearranged the pieces again and again." Levin's fondness for evil weirdness like this is apparent from his novels, which include Rosemary's Baby, The Boys From Brazil, The Stepford Wives & Sliver. No wonder Stephen King called him the "Swiss Watchmaker of Suspense." (It's worth noting though, that Levin also has a lighter side, too. His first play, No Time for Sergeants, about a drafted hillbilly, launched Andy Griffith's career and was the precursor to Gomer Pyle.)

SVCT's next offering, Fiddler on the Roof, opens June 7 for four weekends. You won't want to miss this compelling classic. Group pre-sales are already high, so get your tickets early. We may not have enough seats for this one!

This is my 11th and last President's Message. I hope you have found them worthwhile. If so, let me know sometime. Of not, let our new president, Peter Mandel, know what he should do differently. He listens better.




James (Dan) Pearson as Porter Milgrim






Douglas A. Hagdohl II Director and Lighting Designer






