#### A message from SVCT's President

This year, SVCT wanted to produce a special holiday show to celebrate the season. The challenge was deciding which show to select. For me the answer was clear since I spend time every year enjoying Miracle on 34th Street as a sort of personal tradition. And, every year my family wonders if it's a little strange that I see the same story every year, enjoy it just as much year after year, laugh at the same spots every year, and wipe away a tear at the end, every year. It's a wonderful story that should be seen more than once and shared with the young ones in the family to usher in the Christmas season.

Miracle on 34th Street was first written by Valentine Davies as a story intended for the screen, and the screenplay was written by the film's director, George Seaton. The studio felt it had a great story and a great cast but they took two gambles in the production. One was to use the names of two leading department stores, Macy's and Gimbels, that were competing feverishly in New York City. Both stores agreed to be featured in the film, but only if they could review the film before it was released and could cancel the movie if they felt their stores were not presented in a positive light. The second gamble was that the studio wanted to release it when they sold the most tickets, which was in the summer. So they didn't mention that it was a holiday movie in any of the advertising leading up to the release and hoped the audience would enjoy a Christmas story in May. Of course it was a big hit, running in the theaters for the remainder of the year into the holiday season and every year since.

SVCT's next production is Legally Blonde, a terrific musical performed by our talented teens, and one that can be enjoyed by the whole family. Based on the well known movie, Legally Blonde was a great success on Broadway, running for 600 performances and nominated for seven Tony Awards. I know you will enjoy the music, dance, and fun spirit of the show. Look for it in February.

We at SVCT take great pride in bringing a wide variety of theater to our area: from musical theater classics to wonderful yet lesser known shows; from shows performed by the youth and teens of our community to our main stage productions. We hope you enjoy our productions and will look for opportunities to join our "family" on stage, back stage, at our workshops, or as members so we can continue our tradition of over 40 years of quality theater.




