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A message from SVCT's President



What goes into the making of a Broadway musical? Follies is recognized as having perhaps the best score in Broadway history, but how did it get there?

The music, lyrics, and book for any musical evolve, making it very hard to know when the show is finished. Shows change as they go through workshops and "out of town" trials. Songs are dropped and added. Plot lines are modified or scrapped altogether. Follies, during its development, went through more changes than most musicals. The original plot contained the idea of a reunion, but the reunion was coupled with a murder mystery, where everyone had reasons to kill one another. Nine drafts later, we have the Follies plot you see on our stage. During development a full ten songs were written for the show and subsequently cut as the plot evolved during the many try-outs and previews. Songs were both discarded and tailored as the show slowly made its way to Broadway.

Ultimately opening on Broadway in 1971, Follies was heralded by The New York Times as "among our musical theater's very finest achievements".

Over the years SVCT has been willing and able to tackle some of the more challenging shows in theater such as *Next to Normal* and *God of Carnage* in order to bring a broad and exciting variety of theater to the South Bay. It was time for us to bring Follies to our stage for our community.

This season's next show, based on a classic theater memoir, will be the comedy *Act One*, opening on November 17. It a wonderful comedy about what it takes to bring a show to Broadway. It will make you laugh and touch your heart.

Enjoy the show and please consider joining our theatrical family for opportunities to be on stage or back stage, and to become members. Help us continue our 49 year tradition of quality theater.

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Dramaturg Notes

Stephen Sondheim

Stephen Sondheim was born in New York City on March 22, 1930, to parents who were successful in New York's garment industry. He grew up on the Upper West Wide of Manhattan. His childhood has been described as being isolated and emotionally neglected. It included a custody battle between his parents, the departure of his father, and a hostile relationship with his mother.

Perhaps serendipitously, it also included a friendship with a boy named James Hammerstein, whose father was the playwright and lyricist Oscar Hammerstein II. The elder Hammerstein gave the young Sondheim advice and tutelage in musical theater, and served as a surrogate father to him. Thus began one of the most famous apprenticeships in the musical theatre, as Hammerstein designed a kind of course for Sondheim on the construction of a musical. Sondheim wrote his first of many musicals in prep school.

In the early 1950's, Sondheim moved to Los Angeles and wrote scripts for television. He made his first significant mark on Broadway as the lyricist for Leonard Bernstein's music of *West Side Story*. Collaborators on the show included Hal Prince Producer, Jerome Robbins Choreographer, and book by Arthur Laurents, *West Side Story* opened in 1957.

Sondheim's most well-known works are: Gypsy (1959) – music by Jule Styne, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way To the Forum (1962), Follies (1971), A Little Night Music (1973) – which included the hit song 'Send In The Clowns', Sweeney Todd (1979), Sunday in the Park with George (1984), Into the Woods (1987), Assassins (1990)....

Among his many awards, Mr. Sondheim has received the Pulitzer Prize, an Academy Award, eight Grammy Awards, seven Tony Awards plus a special Tony Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Theatre, and the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2015.

Sondheim is one of Broadway's giants – a master artist whose musicals and songs have inspired theatergoers and charmed listeners for over sixty years.

Follies

Follies is a musical with music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim and book by James Goldman.

History

In 1965 Mr. Sondheim asked screenwriter, novelist, playwright James Goldman, if he had an idea for a musical. Mr. Goldman said he had thought about writing one about a reunion, perhaps of graduates from a college like Vassar, until he read a newspaper item about a reunion of Ziegfeld Follies actresses. In its earliest phase, the show was a murder mystery called The Girls Upstairs. Over many years and many, many rewrites the show evolved into what we now know as Follies.

Synopsis

It is 1971, and the iconic Weismann Theater, now a crumbling shell of its former glory, is about to be demolished to provide precious New York City parking space. Broadway impresario Dimitri Weismann arranges a reunion of the actors, singers, dancers, and personalities who peopled his famous Follies in the years between the World Wars, as a farewell tribute to the doomed building.

In a shabby yet sparkling atmosphere of bittersweet nostalgia, a wide variety of faded glamour girls -- the famous Follies beauties of years gone by -- laugh, reminisce, brag, boast, express regret, and perform the musical numbers which made them famous, trailed by the ghostly memories of their younger selves. Against this volatile atmosphere of drunken remembrances, a decades-old love quadrangle receives a revival when Follies dancers Sally and Phyllis, and their respective husbands, Buddy and Ben -- who used to hang around backstage, waiting for their girls -- meet again. During one night of romance and regret, two crumbling thirty-year-long marriages are put to the test.

Tidbits

In 2017, Sondheim became the first composer-lyricist to win the PEN/Allen Foundation Literary Service Award. The annual prize is given to a "critically acclaimed writer whose body of work helps us understand and interpret the human condition." Other winners of this esteemed award include Tom Stoppard, Gore Vidal, Edward Albee, Salmon Rushdie, J.K. Rowling.

Sondheim became known for his witty, conversational lyrics, his seamless merging of words with music and the variety of his source material. The merciless, poignant psychological profiles in Sondheim songs describe modern man and woman with an acuity no other theater writer can touch. He is the greatest chronicler of married life in all its ambiguities ("Sorry Grateful" from Company), cynicism ("Now You Know" from Merrily We Roll Along) and bitterness ("Could I Leave You?" from Follies). His lyrics sing and sting, as his characters soar and collapse.

Sondheim has been described as introverted and solitary. In an interview with writer Frank Rich, he said, "The outsider feeling – somebody who people want to both kiss and kill – occurred quite early in my life."

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
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
