This play was written by Robert Harling as a tribute to his sister, who died from complications of diabetes, and his mother and the coterie of women who supported them. After opening in 1987, the work broke records at the Lucille Lortel Theatre in Manhattan and ran for three years. Shortly after its debut, the legendary producer Ray Stark bought the film rights, and in 1988 it was made into a movie starring Sally Field and Julia Roberts as the mother/daughter characters, M'Lynn and Shelby. Prepare to laugh...but have your tissues nearby.

This year South Valley Civic Theatre celebrates 51 years of serving the South Bay with live drama, comedy and musical productions. *Steel Magnolias* is the second of five shows being presented this season. Coming in February, our teens will present *Rock of Ages* and in the spring of 2020, the Tony-award winning *Cabaret* will take our stage. Our last show, opening June 19th, will immerse us in the fairytale world of *Beauty and the Beast*. Tickets are available on-line at www.SVCT.org.

I am excited to report that we will be expanding our offerings in the coming year by preserving Limelight Actors Theater at the Gilroy Center for the Arts. 


