



Thank you for joining us here at the Morgan Hill

Community Playhouse for this Limelight by SVCT production of *On Golden Pond*. While the venue may be different than what you might have come to expect from Limelight over the years, we are proud to be continuing to hold up the long tradition of bringing high quality dramatic performances to our region.

Limelight was the brainchild of actor Kevin Heath who created the theater company in 2011. After 43 Limelight productions, Kevin and his husband and theater company co-owner Alan Obata moved away, and, effective January 2020, South Valley Civic Theatre (SVCT) assumed management of Limelight at its location in Gilroy. Unfortunately, as of the end of 2023, we no longer have access to that performance space.

We are actively looking for a new space in Gilroy that will offer the same artistic and patron environment (thrust stage, cabaret style seating, options for dining and bar) as our previous location. As an interim measure, we have scheduled both this show as well our next, *A Comedy of Tenors* (scheduled to open in August 2024), here at the Morgan Hill Community Playhouse.


Act 1 Scene 2: The middle of June. Mid morning.



#### Doug Brook (Bill Ray)



RuthE has appeared in several industrial films, been a session recording vocalist, producer, director, musical director, props' goddess, scenic designer and set dresser, costumer, mentor, etc. for over 400 projects. Ernest Thompson has won an Oscar, two Golden Globes, a Writers Guild Award and a Broadway Drama Guild Award for Best Play. His work has been nominated for a Tony, an Emmy and a British Academy Award. His more than 35 plays have been seen in theatres around the world. The most enduring, On Golden Pond, has been translated into 30 languages, and played in more than 40 countries on six continents including three runs on Broadway, the most recent starring James Earl Jones and Leslie Uggams. His films include On Golden Pond (Katharine Hepburn, Henry Fonda and Jane Fonda), Sweet Hearts Dance (Susan Sarandon and Jeff Daniels), The Lies Boys Tell (Kirk Douglas), 1969 (Robert Downey Jr. and Bruce Dern), The West Side Waltz (Shirley MacLaine and Liza Minnelli), Out of Time, and the live On Golden Pond (Julie Andrews and Christopher Plummer), the last four of which Ernest also directed, as he has his latest films, Time and Charges and Heavenly Angle.
